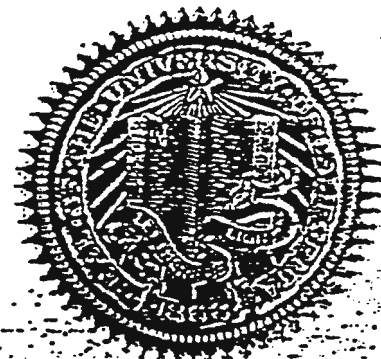

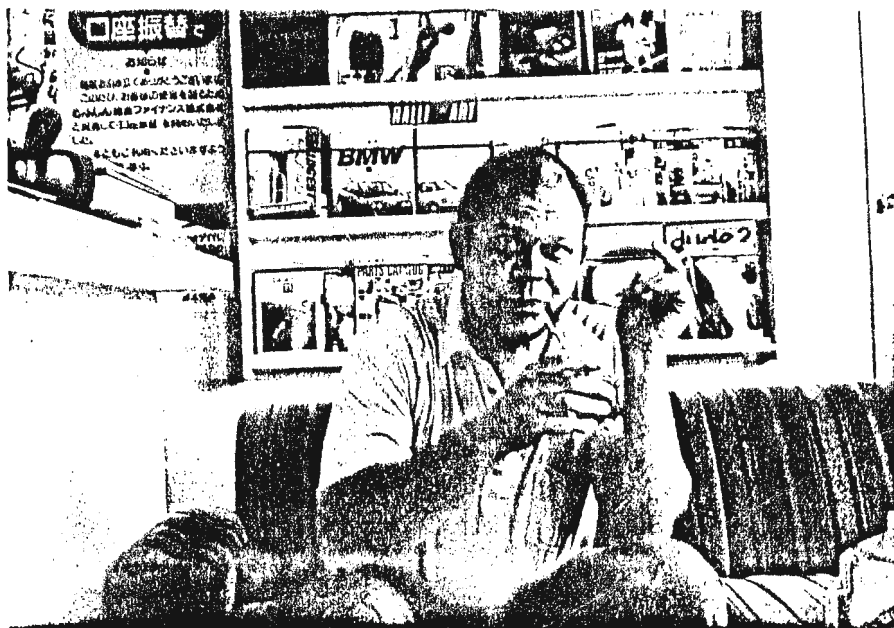

I write this letter on behalf of Mr. David Chadwick in my capacity as President of the Callipeplon Society.


