Now, I strongly feel my responsibility to continue to practice and transmit Uchiyama Roshi's practice and teachings in this country.

I deeply appreciate your interest in establishing a practice place where people can experience the simple and deep zazen practice. Since I started to work for Soto Zen Education Center two years ago, I have a difficulty to work on my vision of Sanshin Zen Community because of busy schedule.
