2. the 25th and 26th. My husband joins me in welcoming you, and has agreed to come to Vermont with us though he is not actively concerned with Zeu at this time. He is a Unitarian and does take part in the Unitarian Church life.

I am exceedingly happy that you are coming; and I assure you that though this was not quite true when I first wrote to you - at this time I can ^{hardly} afford to pay for the round ^{trip ticket}, and am very glad indeed to do so. Zeu is gradually becoming paramount in my life; and it is an honor and a joy to be in contact with one who knows.

I wait for further word from you. Our home is just now. There is only one child here, a boy of 14, and he in winter is mostly in school. Do stop over with us if you can spare the time.
