Everyone ran out of the zendo – many without even a chance to get their shoes off the shoe rack – it was ablaze. Some even had to exit out the chiden door near the altar in the zendo.

Other than that, we soon saw our zendo - Buddha drum, makugio (sp?), bells, Buddha, etc. and our library and food storage areas all burn up in tremendous flame. We could only spray the roof of the kitchen and save it - which we did with the help of the firewall on it.
