TRUTH WORKS

Every principle in scholastic metaphysics and philosophy can be found in the pure doctrine of Jesus Christ. Because of lack of correct instruction in the doctrine of Jesus Christ by those teaching or preaching in the Name of that doctrine, the inquiring mind is obliged to seek in other fields for satisfaction. So man searches for a solution to the problems of life in realms of science, art, and literature. He has reclaimed rich treasure in these fields but he has not attained the satisfaction he knows is his inherent right.

It is not enough to declare dogmatically that Jesus Christ is the Way of life without giving a reason for belief in the fact.

Neglect or inability to explain the gospel of Jesus Christ to the satisfaction of the sincere seeker after the truth has subjugated inquiring Christians to all sorts of fallacies. The unscrupulous have found a fertile field in the uninstructed mind of the average Christian. In consequence he has been harangued and browbeaten into subservient fear of something intangible and awesome rather than having been enlightened as to the tangible benefits and blessings derived from the gospel.

The average Christian accepts his certain duties to church and community with resignation. But now and again some unusual mind begins to inquire and ask embarrassing questions. Though the obstreperous member be threatened with being "cast out of the temple," the threat does not keep the culprit from asking but it does relieve the church body from responsibility to answer his questions. Other bodies admit free speech and open discussion, but since all such is circumscribed by set form and dogma the questioner becomes confused and lets the matter drop.

For those unpredictable persons who insist on higher and better knowledge there must be something more than religious duty and a promise of future reward. There must be an intelligent explanation of how Jesus Christ is the Way and why God can and does give Good to all who ask of him. There must be a reason for faith declared. There must be evidence of some solution to the problems of daily life which enables any man to do more than bear his burden with Christian fortitude. Jesus Christ said, "Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

The teaching of a principle of life should carry with it a solution to the problems of life with such clarity that even though a person might not be able to grasp the abstract principle he would see the benefits of making shining examples of difficult problems. A teaching of a principle of life that does not solve the problems of life must explain itself. If it fails to work it is on the defensive and no amount of accusation toward those who perceive increased life or light can convince such recipients they are in disgrace because they neglect their future rewards for present blessings

The only disgrace is that man neglects his science. Truth works. God works in truth. Whoever asks for understanding of truth will receive his measure of understanding and the reward will be with it.

Anybody may enjoy the privilege of making the gospel of Jesus Christ yield its blessings if he is willing to receive from that source. But in dealing with that gospel he must accept its terms and abide by its laws and modes of operation. The gospel of Jesus Christ comes into consciousness on terms of full possession only, and delivers its rewards now. It does not promise "yet four months and then the harvest." It says, "Behold, I say unto you, Life up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest. And he that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal."

"I say unto you, What things soever ye desire when ye pray, believe that ye receive them, and ye shall have them"

"If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you." "Hitherto have ye asked nothing in my Name: ask, and ye shall receive, that your joy may be full."

Look upward, Godward: desire his Good; believe in the active reality of his Good; ask that it be given unto you in the Name of Jesus Christ; rejoice in the full demonstration of God's Good for you IN his Name.

This simple formula will work for anybody, anywhere, anytime. It demands that full attention be directed God-ward and it fulfills its intention toward whoever practices in faith and love of God. In Jesus Christ man will find that which is all-sufficient and effective NOW.
