GOD IS ALL

WE FREQUENTLY make the statement that God is All, or that God is All-in-all. The statement occurs in one form or another several times in this issue of the magazine. But it will not hurt to say a word more about it; for this is the base on which we stand, and there is where most people part company from us.

This idea is stated frequently in Scripture, as in the famous and often-quoted verse in Isaiah: "Face Me, and so be delivered, all the ends of the earth; for I am God and there is nothing else" (my translation). In the New Testament, the statement is usually put in the future: Christ will be All-in-all. But it is also said that Christ is "the same yesterday, and today, and for ever." So the futurity must be in our becoming aware of what eternally is.

The fact that a thing is stated and repeated in Scripture does not carry too much weight today. After all, men say, you can find anything you want in Scripture - which is true. Yet we find this same thing - that God is the only reality - stated by all the greatest mystics: the giants who have changed our ways of thinking and so have changed the world. Those who study the mystics admit that these men have been completely right in most of what they said, but again they part company with them at this point.

Those mystics who were intellectuals, such as Socrates and Plotinus, "proved" the idea of the Allness of God logically. Since their logic has been unanswerable the scholars have said they "let their logic run away with them"; or they have heaped ridicule upon them - man's constant answer to an unwelcome idea that he cannot refute.

We never try to prove our basic stand, because we know that no one is ever convinced by logical proof. Man's mind simply does not work that way. But we do point out that this axiom explains many things that otherwise are unexplainable.

That God is All, that God is the Only Reality, that the whole material world that seems so real is nothing but a "dream of the senses" explains how Jesus Christ and His followers could do things that everyone knows are impossible, and yet maintain that they did nothing. For what did Jesus do? He knew the Allness of God and the non-reality of everything else. Wherever He went, and there was someone who was receptive, what He knew came forth into visibility, so that others could see it. There is no other reasonable explanation for what He did and what He said. When He raised the dead son of a widow, He did not do anything to the boy. He knew that God is All and God is Life; therefore the boy was not dead, no matter what the appearance. He simply said, "Young man, get up," and the boy got up. That is the proof.

In the opera Parsifal, it is only the innocent fool who sees no evil who can heal the wound of King Amfortas. Have his innocence and purity.

People think that the Truth is impractical. It is most practical. Every desire you have to do something is telling you that you already have that which you seek. The Grace of God is given to all who ask. Grace never judges; it just gives. To thief or saint, it gives freely. It is as though God were saying: "Here it is! take it; it is yours."

You do not have to struggle or strive or resist. Know the Grace and the Glory of God right where you are. If you will consider what resistance is, you will see it is a form of egotism; it is thinking you have power to use. You do not have any power. God is the Only Power. There is only One Mind; you live in it.

Jesus Christ did not recognize the death of Lazarus. He looked up; and as He beheld the Divine Perfection, Lazarus came forth.

He who has looked at a beautiful painting or sculpture is never again the same person. The influence of beauty is silent - but how powerful! The Call of the Spirit is silent, but it is limitless in Power. "Behold, I call all the day long."

To give a concrete example: A woman artist had been successful, doing creative work, and she had achieved a good place for herself. She found herself with a bequeath of an apartment hotel. Since she felt that she had no training to conduct the business of an apartment house, she consulted a metaphysician. He told her: "Art is the expression of Divine Beauty and Order; Divine Order is business ability."

She realized all the good the apartment house was doing, for people had to live in good surroundings - in order and harmony - and she realized that the Divine Intelligence would reveal to her the proper way to run the property. She soon found the apartment being run smoothly, and she found she had increased in her skill in art, for the business experience broadened her vision. She traveled in all parts of the world and became internationally famous.

The mark of a Christian is that he is not suggestible to the race consciousness. He stands firm on the Rock of Christ. The world is preoccupied with the appearances, with the realm of form and confusion. Salvation is being saved from appearances, from this realm of form and confusion. The Truthstudents are acting as a sort of lever to lift the race consciousness. You cannot lift the masses, but here and there you can lift an individual, who in turn does this for others. "A little leaven leaveneth the whole lump." It is not done by personal effort, but here and there others will catch the light from you. And so your firmness, your salvation from all materiality, will save others. A chance word of Truth of yours may be the means of saving someone you have never seen.

In the old metaphysical schools they used to teach: "Make the Truth real to yourself and then your patient (the one you want to help) will catch it, for there is only One Mind." They do not teach that any more, but they should. If the Truth is real to you, your patient will catch what he needs and be healed.

A man I know held an important position in a company, but he suddenly found that the nephew of the president had been taken into the company and set over him. The nephew did not know the business and would blame others for the mistakes that were the results of his own shortcomings. My friend knew so much about the business that he could see what should be done, but he was never consulted. He was simply blamed when the nephew's orders resulted in failure. He became depressed; he developed severe headaches, stomach trouble, and ulcers. He looked for metaphysical help. He was told: "There is but One Mind; It is filled with Infinite Intelligence, Kindness, Order, Harmony. If you dwell on this you will see it."

The next day he had to attend a board meeting. As usual the president asked all the other men for their opinions and neglected him. But suddenly he looked at him and said, "Why, Mr. Smith, it is a long time since we have heard any of your opinions. What is your solution for the problem?" The man answered; and the president said, "Why, I believe this is the answer." After the meeting he asked the man if he would have lunch with him the following day to talk things over. The next day at lunch many things were discussed and the president felt so confident in this man's ability that he made him a consultant. His time was his own - he did not even have to appear at the firm if a letter or telephone call would do - and his salary was more than doubled. There is only One Mind. My answer:

Human faults are buried deep in every person's consciousness. The world, with its manifold deceits, snares the unfortunate souls that remain ignorant of their Divine relation to God their Father. One of the truths that Jesus Christ teaches is that we as sons of God are essentially spiritual and that whenever we

wish we may turn away from the world and begin to purge our consciousness of overmastering desires of the flesh.

There are eight faults that are heedlessly cultivated by every unawakened person who has fixed his attention in the world and is obedient to its laws. The faults are: 1) Gluttony or the pleasures of the palate; 2) Concupiscence or sex; 3) Covetousness or the love of money; 4) Anger or fury toward somebody or something; 5) Dejection or hopeless defeatism; 6) Spiritual Sloth or bitterness of heart; 7) Vainglory or elation over one's worldly achievements; 8) Pride or the dreadful fault of self-importance that devours those who have almost attained a realization of spiritual sonship.

All aspirants are drawn away from contemplation of God to the misery of bodily thoughts. Whenever we repent (turn away from) them we may acquire by grace the benefits of spiritual thoughts such as: modesty, continence, prudence, humility, mercy, temperance, pity, and justice. You have come to the point where you sense the sublime things of God; think on them, and flesh desires will wither. At every opportunity withdraw your attention immediately from awareness of a fault and look toward God in your heart with reverent gratitude. This is difficult at first, for the attention wanders outward because we are not in the habit of directing it inward. "Pray without ceasing," Paul wrote; and Jesus in one of His parables said that men ought always to pray. Remember God in your heart; this is the rewarding way to pray. The Lord, through Isaiah, said: "To whom shall I have respect, but to him that is poor (receptive) and of a contrite spirit, and that trembleth at My words."

Begin now to teach your children to look inward; the Sanctuary of God is in their hearts. If you succeed, you will have done more for them than if you work to leave them a large worldly inheritance. Learn to pray: "Confirm, O God, what Thou hast wrought in me."

Do not judge yourself harshly, for this is a form of pride. All of us were subjected to notions that pass for Truth. "Now this I say, that flesh and blood cannot inherit the Kingdom of God. . . . For this corruption must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality." -- Paul

Dear Mrs. Truesdell:

When I attempt to eliminate the negative memories that flood my mind when I want to meditate, shall I concentrate on past mistakes and by remorse try to dissolve them or should I ignore them? Please give me practical instruction for this is a serious problem. (Mrs. E.N.)

My answer: When we recall past mistakes we had made through ignorance of principles, and try to erase them by pressure of our will or by feelings of sorrow, we increase our sense of guilt and so needlessly suffer untold agonies of spirit. Grief over past events stultifies mind, sickens body, and destroys material affairs. Many persons suffer failure in business because of their intense sorrow over a former offense that veils God's ready forgiveness.

"Behold, for peace I had great bitterness, but Thou hast in love to my soul delivered it from the pit of corruption: for Thou hast cast all my sins behind Thy back."

We have erroneously been taught that remorse will clear our conscience of the bitterness of memories of mistakes. This is not so. It is impossible to have good thoughts when our attention is glued to ruinous notions about something that exists only in our imagination. "He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be abomination."

Recollection of past sins must be immediately expelled for it greatly hinders our longing to enter the courts of the Lord.

Since we move into any given experience by way of our attention to it, we may also move out of an unhappy experience through repentance or turn our attention away from it. What benefit is there in our continually returning to any image that haunts our soul? Our truest test of having received the rewards of repentance is our sense of release from guilt. Such release, of course, is never gained through a superficial act of regret. For if our imagination is stirred pleasantly by a recollection of secret sins while we are attempting to remove their stain from memory during a period of meditation, our hearts are not cleansed. Complete purity of heart comes only when we purge out remembrance of past faults.

Many years ago I wrote a statement that may benefit you:

All the Energy in these memories is pure, spiritual Energy. I now release this Energy from the grip of mortal thought so that It is free to express Itself perfectly in my mind, body, and affairs. For this realization, I thank God in the Name of Jesus Christ.

Isaiah wrote: "Come now, and we will argue together, says the I AM. If your mistakes are as scarlet, they will be as white as snow; if they are red like scarlet cloths they will be like wool. If you are willing and listen, you will eat the good of the land. If you refuse and rebel, you will be eaten by the sword." (Trans. by R.A.Jr.)

God never beholds our mistakes. If we are as merciful toward others as God is merciful to us, we shall know the purity of heart that cleanses our soul of all mistakes and reproaches.
