The test of a true teaching is its vitality. Can it withstand the lustings of the world, the flesh, and the devil? Will it endure by its own nature? Is it complete in itself, or does it look to the world? Is it supported by its own radiance, dependence upon, and practice of itself; or, does it turn to the help of man?

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is not the popular religion. Institutions which purport to represent His Gospel really idolize Jesus the man and teach the story about the man.

Worship of Jesus the man can be likened to a field of plants wherein bulb, sprout, stock, and bud stand in awe of the plant among them which had blossomed and brought forth fruit. Whereas, each plant would be better off attending to its own business of growing and bearing good fruit instead of trying to reflect, or even attempt to appropriate, the bloom from the one that had done the necessary work.

Works and truth go hand in hand. Works follow truth wherever it is practiced. The worshippers of a personal spirit are always looking for some one to come and do something for them. The Jews were looking for a Messiah and were so determined in their belief that He come in some future time they were unable to recognize Him when He was in their midst.

We say we should not do as they; yet, we reject constantly those things which have a tendency to magnify His teaching but which deflate the personal ego. Jesus stated clearly: "I am come in my Father's Name, and ye receive me not: if another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive. Both John the Baptist and Jesus did works that made their names so outstanding that they are to be revered all the days of all generations.

Some people in this time feel that too much attention given to God can, in some manner, detract from personal glory and accomplishments. Just the opposite is true. The Man who came not in His Own Name accomplished works none other was able and attained glory and honor never before equaled and never since duplicated.

This Man revealed the very secrets of life and opened the understanding of other men that they too might comprehend the Scriptures and know the truth. He invited all who would listen to come and partake of Reality and His only stipulation was "Believe - only believe."

His directions were simple: "Watch and pray."

Such simple instructions are not to the liking of egotists and sophists for all credit is placed where it is due and every man receives his rewards in ratio to his believing and watching. We can assume that the most steadfast believer or the most intense watcher is entitled to and receives the greatest reward. Yet, every reward is for the profit of all.

This example will clarify the proposition: A sailor in the crow's-nest of a ship is able to see the shore much sooner than the rest of the crew and passengers. His presence in the crow's-nest and his advanced knowledge is for the protection and benefit of all. Too, he arrives at port along with the others.

Many cults, sects, and religious zealots believe they possess a creedal God who will save their particular congregation and dispense with all others by the very neat process of dropping them alive into a lake of fire. Such devotees know neither the manner of spirit they are nor do they understand the nature, character, or power of God.

Is God impressed by any threat against the evil doer? "I have no pleasure in the death of the wicked."

If Jesus Christ, doing God's will, came not to judge, condemn, or punish, but to save, then all dramatic proclamations wander far afield.

One of the symbols of Spirit is fire. As we analyze the properties of fire we see how it attains the dignity of symbolizing Spirit. It is all-consuming, it is a blessing, it is a vital activity, it tempers that which is useful, and it purges that which is useless.

The fire that symbolizes higher powers and finer ethers of fulfillment for him who aspires to spiritual restoration, might be a dreadful purging to him who insists that the only reality is material and the only action mental.

But God is Love and His all-consuming Love takes its own to itself and tempers all things to its use and steadfast fulfillment of its divine intention. God is Love out of which intelligence emanates as light from fire.

God, like fire, is always the same, yet always changing. Some instructed in the High Watch see nothing new. But soon they will distinguish things spiritual from things mental when their aspiration and vision are toward the Father's house. "I am the Lord, I change not." "Look unto Me." "Only believe."

To The Seeker After Health, Happiness, and Prosperity,

GREETING:

"What can I do to co-operate with my treatment?"

This question is frequently asked by patients. In attempting an answer, let us consider why a person asks for help. Usually he does so because some condition of body, mind, and environment is unpleasant, even intolerable, and there must be a change; relief is sought.

If the patient goes to a healer, it should be for the purpose of being healed from disease or disturbance. Because a seeker has outgrown dependence upon other forms of obtaining relief and has turned to contact true spiritual restoration does not alter the fact that he is subscribing to a system or method of attaining comfort.

That this system was established from the beginning by the All-Knowing and Everlasting God of the Universe only makes it more effective and there for, actually, it is the only true healing agency.

Let us examine the process involved in the more popular method of healing. If a person suffers an ill or ailment, he goes to a doctor in whom he has faith, explains his disease as he sees it, is examined, receives a diagnosis he sees it, is examined, receives a diagnosis and, no doubt, a prescription for medicine. The patient does not insist that his physician explain the entire theory of material medica; neither does he demand to know what ingredients compose the medicine. He would trust his doctor to prescribe the best possible medicine for the quickest and most complete relief.

"How can the patient help the doctor?"

By having such confidence in both doctor and medicine that he obeys all instructions and takes his medicine expecting it to do its perfect work.

Just so does the element of FAITH enter into spiritual healing. Not faith in the physical appearance of the healer, but faith that this particular healer is able to subscribe to and prescribe the true spiritual tonics.

Frequently the healer is asked, "Shall we think good thoughts?" The answer is, "You will, if the treatment you are receiving is truly spiritual."

God gave man a Spirit like unto His very own Spirit. God made man's mind and body, and God's Spirit knows best how to maintain and sustain the works of His hands. There will be no studied "good thinking" or "good acting" but there will be a natural and spontaneous delight in going about thinking and doing good.

There will be times when thinking seems to cease. There will be times of mental stimulation. These will be the effects of spiritual healing; not aids in themselves. Good thinking is good practice. Good acting is good practice. Whatever is good is GOOD.

Some practitioners do mental healing and accomplish good results. Some do physical healing and are apt and efficient in their profession. Some do true spiritual healing that restores wholly, not in part.

"How much does the patient pay for healing?"

We know sufferers of illness who have paid and paid but have received neither relief nor healing. Those who do physical healing charge by the visit, or the case. Certain systems of mental-healing-practice charge by day, week, or month - or, charge by treatment. Such charges are usually \$1.00 a day (or treatment), or \$25.00 a month. This seems reasonable where the healer is sincere and diligent, assuming that the laborer is worthy of his hire.

Spiritual healing has long been identified with free will offerings, or the sense of loving appreciation in the mind and heart of the patient making itself manifest in a gift of value. Free will offerings for spiritual healing should not be confused with the practice of reserving small change in the purse for religious purposes.

The reason a true spiritual healer hesitates to put an exact price on spiritual work is because such work is priceless. Spiritual healing is not merely relief from physical pains and aches, or freedom from mental disturbance, or financial distress, but is a complete restoration and redemption of the whole man in mind, body, affairs, and estate.

By comparison, consider this: If you were to pay four or five hundred dollars for an operation on your body, what price would seem fair for a complete restoration in spirit, soul, mind, body, affairs, and estate?

Would not such service be valuable? Spiritual healing deals with treasures in heaven and gifts of the Spirit. These treasures and gifts are priceless.

A true healer is seldom occupied with the business of collecting. He sends no monthly bill, nor will your account be turned over to a collection agency. But years of experience have proved to the true spiritual healer that those people who actually esteem his services will show their appreciation in substantial ways. And, those who do, go on to receive more and more of the priceless gifts of healing, wholeness, happiness, and prosperity. Such is the Law of the Spirit.
