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WHY DO WE PRAY?

We pray because we want to get in touch with God; because we realize that of ourselves we can do nothing, but with God any thing can be accomplished.

Prayer should always be a refreshing experience. It is an accomplishing power and when exercised, a rightness is the most beneficial practice of man. Prayer is actually the highest form of attainment for through true prayer any one can get any thing at all. "All things whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive."

"The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much."

Most of us utter grievous complaints against God in our prayers. The first tendency in prayer is to go back to our deepest longings, our most cherished desires, and sort them over. This stirs up memories of unfulfillments that have strengthen our life path and the reaction set up is not pleasant.

In our prayer period we sense the magnitude of infinity and our own capacity for the real and, instead of pushing the idea to the limit of consciousness and beyond, we fall back upon our personal ego. This outer ego cannot handle the magnitude of infinity and assuages its frustration by accusation.

The very act of prayer indicates that we have attached the extremity of our false ego and our real nature is beginning to assert itself. Prayer does not spring from the multitude of desires in our mind. But even these desires can be called "good" for, when we come to the limit of desire we are exhausted and, in that moment the inexhaustible side of our nature begins to assert itself and the image--and --likeness of God rises to take dominion.

We enter into prayer because in the depths of our nature we feel the eternal tendency to express now all the infinity of God. Through prayer we attempt to embrace this divinity but refuse to surrender self. So, a conflict between longings unfulfilled and a desire to partake of the fountain of life ensues and before we are aware of what is going on we discover our prayer period filled with attitudes of demand, complaint, hopelessness, and disappointment.

One of the primary lessons in truth is this, whatever you describe you magnify and increase. If in prayer you describe in minute detail all that you lack, all you have failed to achieve, you are magnifying nothing at all and so continue to demonstrate or experience an abundance of lack in increasing measure.

Any need should cause us to reach toward the inner realm for satisfaction and fulfillment rather than agitate us to the point of railing against a God in bodily form dwelling in some place called heaven whence he will deal with us according to his prevailing mood.

The quality of our prayer is directly affected by the direction of our attention. "Men ought always to pray," but even before that they should be aware of the direction in which they are looking. To watch God brings spontaneous utterance of prayer --- prayer of praise and thanksgiving.

"I will bless the Lord at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth. My soul shall make her boast in the Lord: The humble shall hear thereof, and be glad. O magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together. I sought the Lord and he heard me, and delivered me from

all my fears."

Desire, after all, is not desire; it is but the memory of some Good the Father wants to give. The hidden impulse of your heart is your sincerest prayer and upon examination will prove to be a joyous song to the Lord for his excellent greatness, his enduring mercy.

Many people cling to prayer forms, ritual and the like, thinking that in repetition of them they are doing service to God and will be rewarded for their diligence. Any solemnized system of prayer is apt to induce insincerity and the final results growing out of the system tend to limit and restrict the consciousness of the devotee instead of enhance and expand it.

No amount of solemnity can make up for hypocrisy, bigotry, or fanaticism. Constant repetition of pious set forms of prayer is foe to real spiritual development. Frequently prayer is utilized to sanctify more error than truth.

Prayer is used often to justify the suppliant's contentions and wishes; with it he builds ramparts round about him and his (worthy or unworthy) and through it resists both error and enlightenment.

"Thou (shalt) have thy delight in the Almighty, and shalt lift up thy face unto God. Thou shalt make thy prayer unto him, and he shall hear thee; and the light shall shine upon thy ways."

The truest prayer magnifies the Lord, glorifies Deity, speaks praisefully unto the Almighty, not especially for gifts and blessings hoped for, but for the divine privilege of communing with the Most High God, the Father of Lights, the Lover of all living.
