THE KINGDOM OF HEAVEN

WHATEVER WE BELIEVE we are seeking, whatever our apparent goal, we are all in reality seeking the Kingdom of Heaven. This has been acknowledged by the wise of all ages. We have an inner urge for something better, an aspiration for a more ideal state of being.

Religion gets its power from relegating heaven to a time after death. This causes the members to keep up religious appearances and to strive for a passport into the place of future fun- the place where they will be permitted to do all the things they have refrained from doing here, for fear of future punishment.

Poor people have a sense of superiority regarding this place to which they believe they will go, for it is off limits to the rich. The rich find an escape clause in the contract, which tells them that, though it is difficult for them to qualify, it is possible -and of course each one feels an exception will be made in his case. So everyone is heading happily for this future reward. But it is still future which detracts from present possession.

Men are prone to look outside themselves for the satisfactory solution to the problems of life. As a race, they had (and still have) great need of such saving influence as that of Jesus Christ who called them back to base with definite instructions as to where and when the Kingdom of God could be found. Some heard the instruction (as some do today): "Neither shall they say, Lo, here! or, lo there! for, behold the Kingdom of God is within you."

Jesus warned men: "Take heed that ye be not deceived: for many shall come in My Name, saying, I am Christ; and the time draweth near: go ye not therefore after them."

When Christ comes and the Kingdom of God is located, both will be found within consciousness. They will come not with pomp and ceremony, but as a thief in the night, in an hour when we think not.

The Kingdom comes as a seed - in a time of stillness. The spiritual seed is dropped into the seeking soul when, for a moment, the search has ceased, and the seeker rests from his efforts. In this time of quietude, the seed-word descends into the core of the soul, and a new order is ushered into the life of man, a new ingredient is added to the formula of life. Man starts to become a new creature in Christ, a citizen of a new government - the Government of God, the Kingdom of Heaven. The Psalmist, sensing the harvest to come from the germination of this seed, cried out:

"Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever." $\,$

The Scripture says we have an Adamic perversity and though we are sons of God we are prodigals. We rebel against the pious and sanctimonious presentation of advice that is sound enough, but still does not sound right to us. Because of inapt presentation, we reject the teaching of the Way of Life. We do ourselves disservice. We should discard the presentation, but not the principle.

Adam and Eve were sitting pretty - if only they had not tried to outwit Omniscience. The Prodigal had it made - if only he had not tried to separate himself from Omnipresence. If we accept these parables and allegories as pictures of how man becomes alienated from his heritage and how he can get back into the good graces of That which caused him to be, we see that man becomes bored with perfection and dissatisfied with Divinity.

There is a recalcitrance and a perversity in the race. The Scripture calls this "sin"; those who succumb, it calls "sinners." This enticed Adam and Eve out of Eden. This drew the Prodigal out of the Father's house into a far country where it helped him to get rid of his inheritance. This losing of spiritual Substance is not at all difficult.

Spiritual preservation is one of the first laws of spiritual aspiration. This is why there must be new bottles provided to contain the new wine, so that nothing will be wasted. The spiritual Essence is so potent that the least flaw in the bottle will let all of it escape.

In our spiritual ongoing, we sometimes protest against the seeming slowness of our development. We believe we have done all we know how to do to cooperate with our unfolding Christhood, but nothing happens — it is just the same old routine. But even as we protest, we feel different, we are different. We are aware of a new element working within us, which was not there before. We can't explain it, but we sense its import. We intuitively know this to be the new quickening energy promised to those who give Christ Truth an opportunity to do Its perfect work. For this is the seed germinating while taking to itself the strength from the surrounding soil. It is the working of the yeast, as its leavening influence extends to the outermost area of our sense of being.

We learn from physics that the whole universe is composed of energy, which is identical with light. This recalls the statement of John that "in Him (Christ) was Life; and the Life was the light of men." We learn in metaphysics that the Kingdom of God is the high consciousness of Good. So if all things are made of energy and light, and the Kingdom of God is the awareness of the Highest Expression of that Intelligent Energy, we find a sensible approach to some of the difficult claims of Christ Truth; for example, the statement of Jesus: "From the days of John the Baptist until now the Kingdom of Heaven suffereth violence, and the violent take it by force."

John the Baptist represents the attitude and practice just preceding the coming of the Christ Truth. His message was "The Kingdom of Heaven is at hand"; his instruction was "Repent." To repent means to change our minds - to stop looking where we have been looking, to turn back to the Kingdom of God at hand - within. As we have seen, all form is composed of energy. Now we have been sustaining all sorts of forms by our attention. So when we turn we release great pockets of active energy, which when released flies back to its Source, much as water seeks its own level.

The release and upsurge of this energy makes for the violent taking the Kingdom by force. After the energy has been freed, it is stepped up to a higher rate of vibration, which is peaceful and powerful. We see in this the action described by Jesus in His Parables of the Kingdom: the seed taking to itself the energy and substance of the soil, to lift itself up into the air, until the birds - the free ideas - come to roost in the branches of the tree.

We see the leavening action of the yeast, improving the quality of the product, until it becomes the very bread of life. We see the "net, that was

cast into the sea, and gathered of every kind." We see the "householder, which bringeth forth out of his treasure things new and old."

We see too how the Kingdom can be within, and how the Father and Son can come and abide with the people whom they have prepared and will perfect to be inheritors of the Kingdom of Heaven.

AN OBSERVATION

ONLY ONE MAN in the history of the world has ever finished the work that was given Him to do. That one has changed the history of the world more than all other individuals put together. We recognize this fact in that we entitle Him the Savior of mankind. We recognize it in that we measure time from the date of His birth, and in that we call ourselves Christians. We admit that in Him was "all the fullness of the Godhead bodily," and that He proved this by His resurrection and ascension. We admit these facts, because they are inescapable;

but how often do we accept as working hypotheses the logical conclusions of them?

If the Man Jesus Christ was God and Very God, it follows that His words are the most vital words ever spoken. It follows that His teaching is the touchstone, whereby we test every theory and every doctrine to see if it is valid. As John said, "Try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world. ... Every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God." The words of Jesus Christ are the light with which we examine the rest of Scripture and all other sacred and profane writing. Further, they are, in themselves, Spirit and Life, as Jesus declared; and they shall not pass away, though heaven and earth do pass away.

The acceptance of the words of Jesus as the norm of doctrine is objected to on the grounds that those who do thus accept them do not agree among themselves, that the early Church substituted a doctrine about Christ for His teaching, and that the Synoptic problem and textual problems make it impossible to determine exactly what His teaching was. None of these objections is valid; and, if any of the objections were, we would be in the sad predicament of having lost the greatest treasure that the human race ever received, the instruction of the Son of God. Disagreements, however, mean simply that we need a more intense, honest, and unbiased study of our sources. The early Church did not substitute a doctrine about Christ for His teaching, because His teaching was primarily about Himself. As James Stalker remarks, "The center and soul of His preaching was Himself." As for the Synoptic problem, John has long been recognized as the most spiritual of the Gospels, and this is precisely what one would expect in a book written by the beloved disciple of the Master, which is what John purports to be.

The substance of Jesus' teaching is clear and unmistakable in spite of differences of opinion with respect to minor details. In any event, the words of Jesus that have been preserved to us are the highest teaching that we have, so we should bend every effort to understanding them, rather than becoming lost in the dead letter of scholarly quibbles.
